St. Mark's Church hosts families in the Family Promise program. Our obligation is to host families for one week, approximately every six weeks. ## Church Furnishings and Ornamentations A continuing series . . .

In this installment of an occasional series on church ornamentation, we turn to one of the newest liturgical elements in the church. It is located in the sanctuary. In many Western Christian traditions (including Anglican/Episcopal), the area surrounding the altar, typically between the rail and the east wall, is architecturally considered the *sanctuary*. Next time you are at the altar rail to receive the Eucharist, look to your right to the short wall beneath the Resurrection Window. You will see a beautiful brass sanctuary lamp. It was

Blessed by Fr. Rick during the September 26 liturgies.



The sanctuary lamp (also tabernacle lamp, altar lamp) is positioned to the right of the credence table and tabernacle and serves as a reminder that Christ is truly present (Real Presence) whenever the sacrament is reserved. The lamp is illuminated by a seven-day candle that burns continually. It is darkened only when the altar is stripped as part of the Maundy Thursday liturgy. It is not relit until after the first Eucharist of Easter when the reserve sacrament is once again present in the tabernacle. The sanctuary lamp is given to the Glory of God by Corey and Kent Rutledge. Thank you, Corey and Kent for this beautiful and lasting gift that will enhance our worship and liturgies at St. Mark's, not only for the present congregation but for generations to come!




