




# Stewardship Sunday ~potluck to follow each service~




Girlfriends Unlimited is St. Mark's women's ministry dedicated to the philosophy of befriending, belonging, believing and becoming.

We are excited to offer the Episcopal Church's course, **Sacred Ground,** at St. Mark's beginning January 2023. **Sacred Ground** is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. Small groups are invited to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity.

The 11-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories.

**Sacred Ground** is part of **Becoming Beloved Community,** The Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

The initial circle will begin in January 2023 and will run weekly or bi-weekly through the spring. Each in-person session will be 90 minutes. Tentatively, Monday from 6:30 to 8:00.

Each circle is limited to **10 participants** plus a facilitator. Two texts are required for each participant, partial cost paid through a grant from the Diocese of Wyoming. All other class materials are provided through online access.

#### What Do Ya Know?

Have you ever wondered about those stained-glass windows up high in our sanctuary? These exquisite works of art are known as clerestory windows. In his article from Architectural Digest, Eric Allen wrote, "The use of clerestories—a row of windows well above eye level—stretches all the way back to temples in ancient Egypt. Since then, they've been a favorite feature in religious structures for their ability to flood vast spaces with natural light, creating interior environments so open and bright they can feel downright heavenly" (https://

www.architecturaldigest.com/gallery/clerestory-windows-transform-a-room). The Middle English word *clerestorie*, pronounced CLEAR-story, means "clear story," which describes how an entire story of height was "cleared" to bring natural light to sizable interiors (https://www.thoughtco.com/what-is-a-clerestory-window-178425). Next time you are at St. Mark's, particularly take a look at the front north

upper window. It is mostly all shades of purple, except for a hint of light in the middle, highlighting Jesus. Spectacular! May all of the stained-glass windows at St. Mark's, particularly our clerestories, bring you to a holy place as you worship and pray in the sanctuary. What do ya know?

## What Do You Know About Advent?

Advent is the first season of the church year, beginning with the fourth Sunday before Christmas and continuing through the day before Christmas. The name is derived from a Latin word for "coming." The season is a time of preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord's nativity, and for the final coming of Christ "in power and glory." The first Sunday of advent can rightly be thought of as the New Year's Day of the liturgical year.


