


SAVE THE DATES

What Do Ya Know?

What do we believe as Episcopalians? Well, I suppose it starts with God. Then our beliefs were delivered by God over hundreds of years through many writers of the Hebrew Scriptures, or the Old Testament, the New Testament, and many believe the middle books as well, or the Apocrypha. However, we do not consider the Bible a rule book necessarily. For instance, we allow marriage after a divorce has occurred, even though it is considered adultery (Matthew 19:9). We also do not literally cut off someone's hands if they are caught stealing or if they stumble, nor the foot nor the eyeball (Mark 9:43-47). We do believe that the Bible contains everything necessary for salvation. We believe in Jesus as our Savior. What we as Episcopalians believe, our statement of theology, can be found in the Book of Common Prayer/BCP. Other than some historical documents and liturgical tables, one can turn to virtually any page of the BCP, particularly the catechism (p. 845 ff), and learn what we believe to be true. It is an interesting exercise. Randomly open the Book of Common Prayer and begin to read...and learn what we believe. What do ya know?

Second Annual John Roberts Festival

On Saturday, June 3, Betsy Taggart and John Peacock attended the Second Annual John Roberts Festival at Fort Washakie. About 150 Episcopalians from around the Diocese gathered to honor The Rev. John Roberts and to see the series of commissioned paintings by acclaimed Irish artist Brian Whelan. John Washakie, grandson of Chief Washakie, also spoke. Following these presentations, The Rev. Roxanne Friday led a commemorative liturgy utilizing largely indigenous prayers and translations. At the conclusion of this service, everyone gathered for lunch in St. David's Parish Hall.

John Roberts was a man very much ahead of his time. He honored the native languages and cultures of the Shoshones and Arapahos that made their homes on the Wind River Reservation. It was his deep and abiding friendship with Chief Washakie that ultimately led to the Chief's baptism. The Chief also donated 160 acres of land to the Episcopal Church. This is where St. David's was built; it still serves Episcopalians in the Fort Washakie area.

Flower Dedications

Here are some of the occasions recognized in the last few weeks: commemoration of parents' 1935 wedding, thanksgiving for a 54th wedding anniversary, in memory of parents given by their three sons, a teenager's birthday, a high school senior's graduation. 



Our next scheduled workshop is Wednesday, July 19.






