



#### Welcome to the Season of Epiphany

"What child is this?" we sang at Christmas. Sunday by Sunday, the Epiphany season celebrates the meaning of the Incarnation: that God came among us in a child fully human, fully divine. Jesus came among us, shared our human nature, showed us how to live abundantly, and defeated the power of sin and death, to ultimately bring us all home to be with Him forever-exciting, awe inspiring, and mysterious.



What is Epiphany? According to Webster's dictionary, epiphany has two meanings of significant importance for us. One, Epiphany, observed January 6th, is a church festival in the Western church commemorating the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, the rest of God's family. Fun fact: tradition fixed the names of the 'magi,' wisemen, or 3 kings, as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Secondly, an epiphany is defined as an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure. In our journey of relationship with our living God, we often come to new realizations and discoveries as we open our eyes and hearts to God's voice in our lives.

During Epiphany season, we will hear the testimony of John the Baptist to Jesus as the Son of God. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration where Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed. We are called to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity recorded in the gospels of the Epiphany season.

As we begin the new year of 2024, what new realization, what new calling might you experience in your encounter with the living God who desires to love, guide, and strengthen and draw near to you?



#### Chalking the Door: An Epiphany Tradition

\*Chalking the Door" is a short liturgy for marking the church and our homes with sacred symbols and asking God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year. In this service, we mark our front or main entrance doors with chalk as a sign that we are inviting God's presence into the places, relationships, and situations here at St. Mark's and in our homes.





#### The Symbols

A common way of chalking the door is to write these symbols along the doorframe (updating the last two digits with each new year): **20 + C + M + B + 24** The first and last numbers comprise the four digits of the current year (2024, 2025, etc.). The letters "C," "M," and "B," come from the three traditional names for the unnamed Magi in Matthew 2: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar (also spelled "Balthazar"). Some also suggest that the letters can represent "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," which means "May Christ bless this dwelling!" A cross is placed between each set of numbers and letters.

#### For your Homes

All those present will receive a stick of blessed chalk along with instructions for chalking the front door in your individual homes.




